Luan B. Rivera, a member of the Ramona Unified School District Board of Education in San Diego County since 1994, former teacher and longtime school and community volunteer and activist, is past president of the California School Boards Association (CSBA).

Rivera has served on CSBA's Delegate Assembly since 1996, was on the CSBA Board of Directors and Executive Committee from 2004-2007, has been Vice President of the San Diego County School Boards Association, is a graduate of CSBA's Masters in Governance Program and holds both a multiple-subject teaching credential and an English as a Second Language certificate. Additionally, she serves on the San Diego County Superintendents Achievement Gap Task Force and was the Chairperson of California's Cities, Counties and Schools (CCS) Partnership for 2007.
